

Parenting Style Axis



Nurturing: expressed love, comfort, kindness, attention, security, emotional validation, non-sexual touch, listening, encouraging, protection, and never using punishment.

Structure: allowing age-appropriate decisions, natural consequences, giving guidance, facilitation and coaching, teaching, problem-solving, setting family rules and limits together, having routines, rituals, celebrations, providing supervision and monitoring, and reasonable age-appropriate expectations. Modeling responsible citizenship.
